The memory of this special day is etched forever, in the hearts and minds of those who were present to witness it.







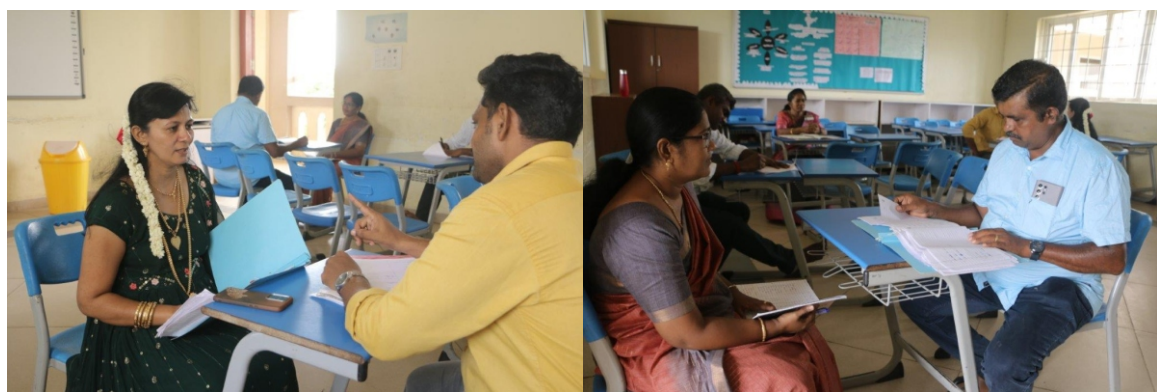

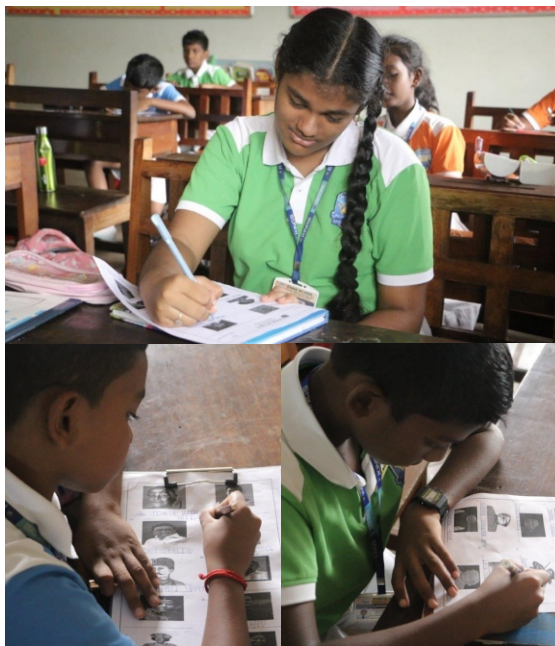

The programme was held at the Matric Music Room from 11.00 a.m. to 12.30 p.m. The resource person was Mrs. Hebsi, Vice Principal, Nehru Nursing College, Vallioor. The session began with a welcome address by the Career Guidance Coordinator, followed by the guest's presentation using a PPT. Mrs. Hebsi explained the Importance of Allied Health and Paramedical Sciences in Healthcare and gave a detailed overview of the various courses available such as: Nursing, BPT (Physiotherapy), OT Technology, B. 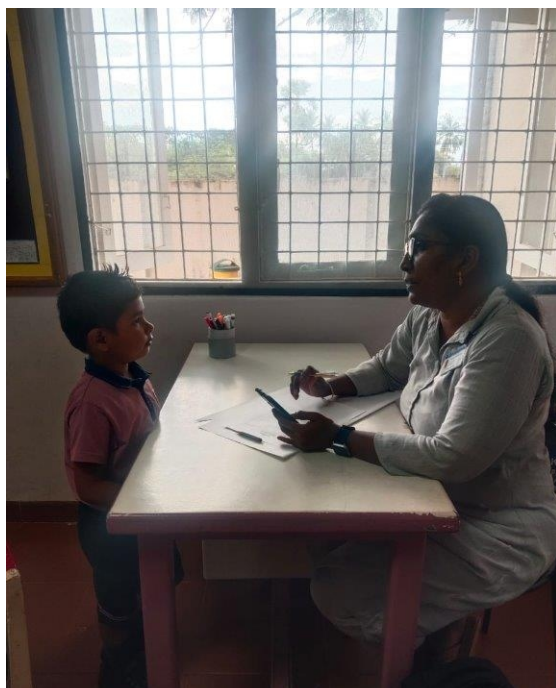
