CAREER GUIDANCE PROGRAMME



Marine aspirant students from Classes IX to XII attended a session on November 8, 2025. The session was handled by Mr Jacob Senthil Kumar, Academic Counsellor from James Marine College, Thisaiyanvilai. The programme was highly informative and beneficial for students exploring career options in the Marine field. Kings School Management expressed their gratitude to the resource person and honoured him with a memento.

Career Guidance Department organised a Career Guidance Programme for sports students of classes IX to XII on 22nd November. Thirty-Three students took part in the session held at the Burden Centre.

The session began with a welcome address given by the Kings School Career Guidance Coordinator Mr Alwyn, who welcomed the Sports Head, Mr. Joshuva, the resource person for the programme.



Mr. Joshuva presented various performance-related career options available for sports students in higher education in India. He also explained how many colleges give special importance and admission benefits to sports students. He highlighted that sports students can secure jobs in both central government sectors and private sectors after completing higher education. He also spoke about the role and importance of Physical Education Teachers and explained the pathway for students to become a Physical Education Teacher after completing +2. The session also included insights into Sports Biomechanics and its academic and career relevance. Additionally, he listed several health-related sports careers, such as Sports Psychology and Sports Nutrition.



Visit to Britannia factory, Gangaikondan



The students of Classes 5, 6 along with 10 teachers visited the Britannia Factory located in Gangaikondan. The trip was both educational and enjoyable, giving us a first-hand experience of how biscuits are manufactured on a large scale.

The students observed the complete process from mixing the ingredients to baking, cooling, packing and labelling. The machines were highly automated, and the hygiene standards were maintained very strictly. The staff patiently explained about the safety precautions, quality control and the importance of maintaining cleanliness in a food production environment.



The children thoroughly enjoyed the trip and they were fascinated to see the speed and accuracy of the machines in the packing section.



HINDI WORKSHOP



A workshop was attended by the teachers of Hindi Department. Innovative methods of Teaching Hindi Grammar & Experiential Learning at Hotel Palmyra Grand Inn, Tirunelveli. Dr. Sudha Trivedi conducted a highly interactive and practical training session on “Effective Hindi Teaching through TLM, Games and Digital Apps” on November 22, 2025.

COMPUTER WORKSHOP



A computer workshop on Artificial Intelligence (AI) was conducted for teachers to enhance their digital skills and awareness of modern technology. The main objective of the workshop was to introduce teachers to AI, explain its benefits in education and demonstrate how AI tools can be effectively used through mobile phones.

The workshop highlighted several benefits of AI for teachers. Teachers found Meta AI helpful for quick reference, content creation and idea generation. Another important session focused on creating videos using AI through mobile phones. Teachers were trained to:

- Convert text into videos using AI applications
- Add images, background music and voiceovers automatically
- Create educational and presentation videos with minimal effort
- Use AI-based video tools for online and blended learning

This session encouraged teachers to integrate AI-generated videos into their teaching methods. The AI workshop for teachers was highly informative and beneficial. It helped teachers understand the practical use of AI in education and inspired them to adopt AI tools for effective teaching and learning. The workshop successfully enhanced teachers' confidence in using AI technology in their professional work.

SPECIAL ASSEMBLY**“Science in Everyday Life!”-**

The Science Department conducted a Special Science Assembly “INNOV8” for Classes 1-12 in the month of November to promote curiosity, creativity and scientific thinking among students. Each class displayed a unique presentation reflecting simple yet meaningful scientific concepts.



The Science Assembly began with a beautiful welcome song presented by our talented students. The song highlighted the wonders of science in nature, everyday life and the curiosity that drives young minds. It set a positive, energetic mood for the entire programme. Students performed a variety of interesting science activities, demonstrating concepts in a fun and understandable way. These hands-on activities encouraged critical thinking and helped students connect science with real-life experiences. Students presented creative demonstrations to show the difference between healthy food and junk food. Sugar content experiment using soft drinks, healthy plate display showing the balance of nutrients. The message was : "Healthy food gives energy; junk food takes it away".





The performance encouraged everyone to make better food choices for a healthier future. One of the highlights of the assembly was the Periodic Table Dance. Students represented different elements through creative movements and colourful props. This lively presentation helped everyone remember the elements in a fun and musical way. Classes VI -VIII concluded the assembly with a patriotic song dedicated to our country, filling the atmosphere with pride and harmony.


