



## FINANCIAL LITERACY TRAINING PROGRAMME



A Financial Literacy Training Programme was successfully conducted by Eduvate for the teachers handling Classes 1 to 8 at the Burden Center on January 3, 2026. The programme was hosted and facilitated by Mr. Nalin and Mrs. Ramya.

The training commenced with a slideshow presentation on the key points of financial literacy, which focused on understanding money and its value, income and expenses, saving habits, budgeting skills, needs versus wants, responsible spending, basic banking concepts and the importance of entrepreneurship. The presentation highlighted how these concepts could be introduced effectively at different grade levels through age-appropriate classroom practices.

This was followed by a series of well-structured and engaging activities aimed at strengthening practical understanding. As a warm-up activity, teachers sat in a circle and introduced themselves, briefly sharing their talents, favourite colour and the reason behind their choice. This activity helped build rapport and created a positive learning environment. Overall, the Financial Literacy Training Programme by Eduvate, hosted by Mr. Nalin and Mrs. Ramya, was informative, interactive and impactful. The programme significantly enhanced teachers' understanding of financial literacy and equipped them with practical strategies for effective classroom implementation.




